Course Overview: This course is designed as a seminar which emphasizes writing and reading activities in the major genres of poetry, scriptwriting and short fiction. Students will explore the writer's craft by reading a variety of texts and composing original works of poetry, drama and short & flash fiction. A writing portfolio may culminate the course.

- Meet deadlines and Be both a writer and an editor
- Write on a daily basis and Take criticism
- Read closely other writers' work and Develop writing processes using various techniques
- Develop self-awareness about their own writing *and* Respond meaningfully to works in progress by peers

Materials and Resources to Support Student Learning:

Texts for class include: poetry, fiction, non-fiction, drama, screenplay, children's literature, essay, memoir (in excerpt or full). Students should bring a Chromebook, paper, writing utensils, and handouts to class on a daily basis. Students will be accessing Classroom frequently.

Chromebooks: It is expected that students bring their charged Chromebooks to class every day along with any other handouts or assigned books.
