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Course Overview: This course is a college-level seminar that involves extensive reading, writing, collaboration, higher-level thinking, and research. Students are expected to work with a very high degree of independence as they study a variety of genres, develop sophistication in critical analysis, and refine elements of written expression and style. Summer reading and writing are required. Students will also write creatively and develop a final extended essay. At the end of the course, students have the option to take the Advanced Placement Test. This course is recommended for students who are willing to take up the challenge, responsibility and rigor of both guided and independent academic inquiry.

Vision of the Successful Student And Core Competencies:

Students will...

- be able to analyze different genres based on close reading
- be able to collaborate effectively in small groups to expand understandings of outside reading texts
- be able to identify literary and rhetorical devices
- be able to effectively explore universal themes through the use of creative projects
- be able to demonstrate an understanding of a sustained research project by both oral and written
 presentations

Materials and Resources to Support Student Learning: Students will receive readings (novels, essays, & articles—full, as well as excerpted) plus various handouts regarding writing. Students are expected to bring writing utensils and a fully charged Chromebook to class every day. Because chromebooks are provided, students are not permitted to use cell phones.

Late Work Policy

If circumstances prevent you from completing an assignment on time, you must let me know ahead of the assignment due date. Letting me know ahead of time will grant you a three-day extension with no penalty. However, you may have no more than **two** extensions a semester.
