Course Overview: English for Multilingual Learners provides multilingual students with many opportunities to improve their skills in reading, writing, speaking, and listening. Each unit of study will focus on a specific genre of writing (such as narrative, expository, or argumentative) and will have a distinct thematic focus. Whole-class reading experiences provide a common base for class discussion and activities, while small-group or individual assignments help students progress at their own pace. Students will practice reading strategies to improve comprehension, such as chunking, annotation, connecting to background knowledge, and previewing text structures. They will also practice interpretation strategies to improve their analysis. Partner and group-work activities give students opportunities to practice their oral and listening skills.

Vision of the Successful Student And Core Competencies:

A successful student in this course will:

- will learn and use a variety of reading strategies to respond and interpret texts.
- write in a wide variety of genres and use a variety of writing techniques.
- develop researching skills such as evaluating source credibility, searching school databases
- consider the purpose for the text and the writer's motives, and evaluate multiple interpretations of a single text.
- evaluate the ideas of others, share ideas during class discussions, and develop skills as a peer responder.

Materials and Resources to Support Student Learning: Novels, poems, plays, non-fiction texts, and handouts will be distributed in class. Students will be expected to bring a charged chromebook, notebooks, pens or pencils, and any other required materials to class on a daily basis.
