Course Overview: This course explores the role of poetry in our modern multicultural global society. Students will analyze lyrics to popular music, performance poetry, such as slam poetry, in addition to examining the works of revolutionary twentieth and twenty-first century poets from around the world. Students will also have the opportunity to develop their own original poetry. The course culminates with the development of a poetry portfolio which includes both original poetry and contemporary poems that have influenced students' everyday lives.

- Recognize that readers and authors are influenced by individual, social, cultural, and historical contexts

Materials and Resources to Support Student Learning:

Students will be given a variety of texts and resources. Students will be expected to bring chromebooks, texts, and any other required materials to class on a daily basis. In addition to assigned classroom texts, Google Classroom may provide useful links that support students' learning.

It is expected that students bring their charged Chromebooks to class every day along with any other handouts or assigned books.
