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Course Overview: The major goal of this course is to help students use the English language with clarity and precision and to broaden their stylistic fluency as writers. Through writing, speaking, and reading experiences, students will practice using language in its various functions, develop an appreciation for the power of language, improve language skills for critical thinking, increase their facility with standard English, and become aware of language as a product and shaper of culture. Conducting research and expressing that research in written form is an integral element of the course. Writing assignments emphasize the skills and strategies which serve as preparation for college composition courses.

- Understand and identify rhetorical choices in non-fiction texts
- Write informative texts that examine and convey complex ideas while making intentional choices
- Demonstrate knowledge of media literacy through research

Students will receive non-fiction readings (memoirs, essays, & articles—full, as well as excerpted) plus various handouts regarding writing. Students are expected to bring a charged Chromebook, as well as writing materials to class everyday.
