Course Overview: The primary goal of this full year course is to help students use the English language with clarity and precision and to broaden their stylistic fluency as writers. Through the close reading of selected texts, students deepen their understanding of the ways writers use language to achieve a desired effect. Students will analyze texts representing a variety of media, considering each work's speaker, content, and audience, as well as context. Students will appreciate and utilize language in its various functions, develop an appreciation for the power of language, improve language skills for critical thinking, and increase their facility with standard English. Writing assignments will reflect the multimodal work of real-world writers and will emphasize the skills and strategies which serve as preparation for college composition courses. Students will develop speaking and listening skills in order to become more confident communicators.

Vision of the Successful Student And Core Competencies:

The successful student will read and write both inside and outside of class regularly. While in class, students will be expected to actively participate, work collaboratively, use analytical thinking skills, draw from outside knowledge, and communicate effectively. The successful student understands that writing is a process that requires multiple drafts and revisions, and will embrace opportunities to improve their writing while continuing completion of daily assignments.

It is, at all times, the responsibility of the student to act in accordance with the concept and definition of academic integrity, including not only the avoidance of plagiarism, but also other actions further outlined in the "Bobcat."

Materials and Resources to Support Student Learning: Students will receive various articles, documents, and visuals throughout the year.
