**Course Overview:** This semester course is designed to strengthen students' understanding of social issues, injustices, and implications in our ever changing world. Through learning how to identify the "alternate voices," an individual is strengthening their skills to more fully understand the complexity of conflict, the diversity of our culture, and building empathy and discussion skills.

## Vision of the Successful Student And Core Competencies:

Successful students will read and prepare outside of and during class several days a week. They will demonstrate respect, responsibility, self-advocacy, open-mindedness, and intellectual curiosity. Students will be challenged to work at a high level of independence and scholarship, which requires more thinking in the abstract and beyond their own personal experiences. Successful students will engage with an open mind in the reading and meet deadlines. Materials and expectations will be differentiated according to students' needs.

Throughout the semester students will:

- Engage in reading fiction and non-fiction texts
- Reflect on readings through journal entries
- Connect and synthesize classroom terminology and ideas with texts and personal experiences

Students will adhere to the standards for behavior set forth in the student handbook (The Bobcat). Students should pay particular attention to the rules regarding plagiarism and academic integrity.

## Materials and Resources to Support Student Learning:

Students will be provided with various texts, including literature excerpts, news articles, films, and critical essays to examine throughout the course. Students are expected to bring a charged Chromebook, writing materials, and handouts to class everyday.
