Course Overview: The Black/African American and Puerto Rican/Latino Course of Studies is a one credit, year-long, elective in which students will consider the scope of African American/Black and Puerto Rican/Latino contributions to U.S. history, society, economy, and culture. Students will examine how historical movements, legislation, and wars affected the citizenship rights of these groups both separately and together. The course is an opportunity for students to explore accomplishments, struggles, intersections, perspectives, and collaborations of African American/Black and Puerto Rican/Latino people in the U.S. The course utilizes a project-based and inquiry-based approach to deliver content rich in student choice and personalized learning experience.
