Course Overview:

This course will examine the history of political institutions, economic systems, social structures, and cultures in the modern Western world. European history will be examined in depth, and historic periods under study include the Renaissance, the Protestant Reformation, the Age of Absolutism, the Enlightenment, the Age of Revolutions, the Industrial Revolution, Imperialism, the World Wars, the Cold War, and the present day. Besides learning about European History, this course will focus on writing and researching like a historian. Thus, this is a reading and writing intensive course. Students who earn a final grade of D- or above are eligible for UCONN credit. **Students who take this course are abiding by UCONN’s grading policies.**

Vision of the Successful Student And Core Competencies:

The students will understand:

- Literacy skills needed to demonstrate effective reading and writing in the subject area.
- Research and writing skills that historians utilize to study history.
- The application of historical skills by reading, writing, and analyzing historical topics in order to form arguments that are supported by primary and secondary research.
- The spread of religious change and conflict throughout European history.
- The change in gender relations throughout European history.
- The rise and fall of political movements and governments throughout European history.
- The causes and impact of cultural and intellectual developments throughout European history.
- The major historic trends in European history.

Materials and Resources to Support Student Learning:

- Textbook: *Western Heritage, Since 1300* by Donald Kagan and others
- Historical Analysis: *After the Black Death* by George Huppert and *The Days of the French Revolution* by Christopher Hibbert
- Supplemental primary source readings relating to the time period under study.
- Supplemental secondary readings from periodicals such as: *History Review* and *History Today*.
