The UNCF **HBCU** Resource Guide will help you learn more about historically Black colleges and universities (HBCUs). This document provides information on scholarships, college-planning resources, key facts about HBCUs and more.

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# WHAT IS AN HBCU?

In Title III of the Higher Education Act of 1965, Congress officially defined an HBCU as a school of higher learning that was accredited and established before 1964, and whose principal mission was the education of African Americans. HBCUs offer a rigorous academic learning environment, innovative programs for students, culturally relevant curricula and activities, and a welcoming environment for all students. They prepare students of all races for leadership and life after graduation. There are 101 HBCUs across the nation.<sup>1</sup>

# DID YOU KNOW?

Three years after graduation, **HBCU graduates earn \$10,000 more annually** than individuals with only a high school diploma.<sup>2</sup>

An HBCU graduate **working full time throughout his or her working life can expect to earn \$927,000** in additional income due to a college credential.<sup>3</sup>

The average cost of attendance at **four-year HBCUs in 2016-17 was \$23,885** compared to **\$32,951 for four-year non-HBCUs**.<sup>4</sup>

HBCUs represent only three percent of America's colleges and universities<sup>5</sup>, yet they produce **16% of bachelor's degrees and 20% of STEM bachelor's degrees**<sup>6</sup> received by Black students.

**The top 10 institutions** where African American science and engineering Ph.D.s earned their bachelor's degrees are HBCUs.<sup>7</sup>

Research shows that **African American HBCU grads report having experienced more support and higher levels of engagement** than their peers at non-HBCUs.<sup>8</sup>

## AFRICAN AMERICAN HBCU GRADS ARE:

- More likely than non-HBCU African American grads to report having at least one professor who made them excited about learning (**74% vs. 62%**) and professors who cared about them as people (**58% vs 25%**)
- More likely to be thriving in purpose and financial well-being than non-HBCU African American grads
- More likely to strongly agree that their university prepared them well for life outside of college (**55% vs. 29%**)<sup>9</sup>

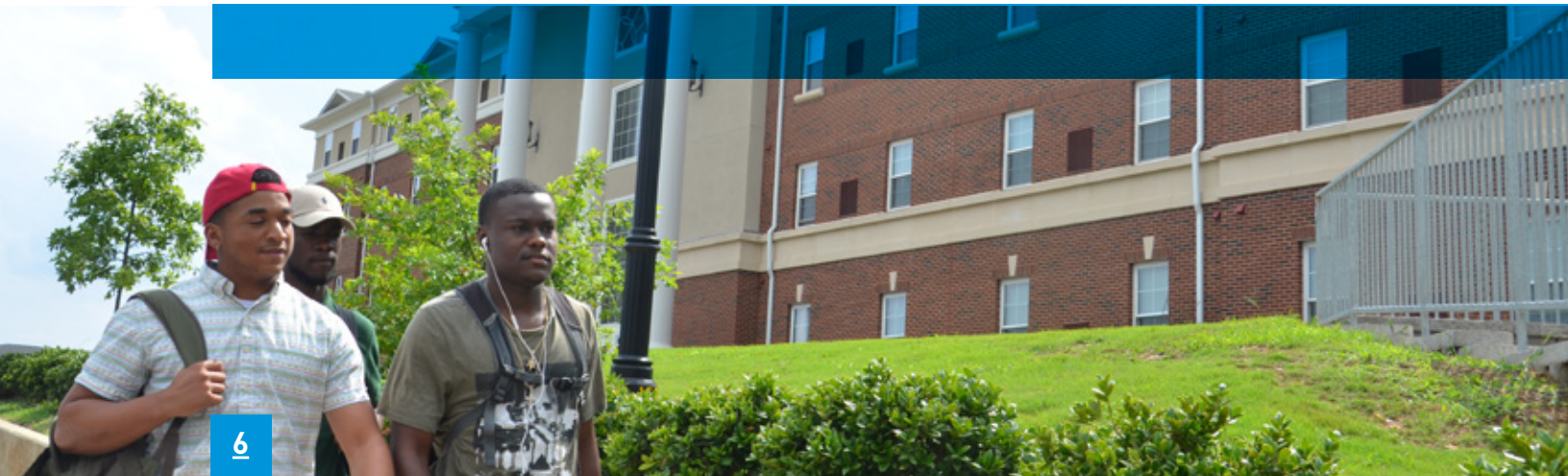

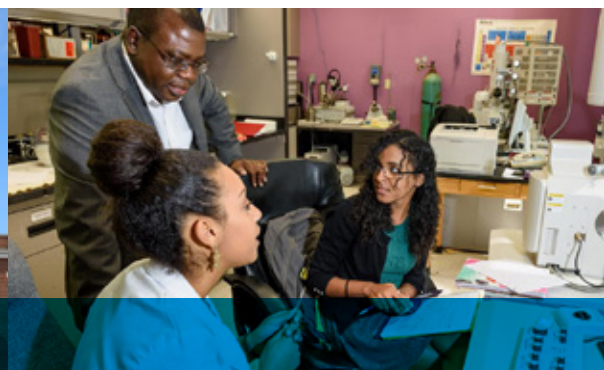
